WRITING YOUR BEST CLASSIFIED AD

- 1 Start with the item you are selling or the service you are offering. This makes it easier for the reader to locate your item or service. Be specific in which category you want your advertisement placed (see listings below).
- 2 Do not try to include too many items in single advertisement. Readers may see only the first item and overlook others that would receive more attention separately.
- 3 Check your spelling. Brand names are sometimes unique and not known to the proofreader. Include your telephone number in case there are questions in the preparation of your advertisement.
- 4 Include the price of the item you are selling. Studies indicate more than half of classified ad readers do not respond to advertisements that do not include a price.
- 5 Keep abbreviations to a minimum. Make it easy for readers to understand what you are selling or offering.
- 6 Place yourself in the reader's position. Ask what you would like to know about the item for sale or the service offered. Include information such as brand name other specific descriptions of an item.

Solid Waste Disposal In NC Reaches Historic Low

A state report finds that people disposed of less solid waste in North Carolina land-fills last year than any previous year in nearly two decades, due largely to the economic recession.

Solid waste was disposed of at a rate of 1.07 tons per capita in 2008-09 – a sharp decline from the previous year and the lowest disposal rate since 1995-96, according to the "North Carolina Solid Waste Management Annual Report."

"Our analysis indicates that the reduction in disposal is a direct result of the economic recession," said Dexter Matthews, director of the state Division of Waste Management. "Waste previously created by the housing and building markets is not being produced and, therefore, is not ending up in North Carolina landfills."

The annual report uses data and other information collected from 655 local governments, 371 solid waste management facilities and

152 state agencies, institutions and schools. Information gathered by the state includes how many tons of materials recycled, and how counties and facilities disposed of solid waste. The state Department of Environment and Natural Resources, with assistance from the state departments of Administration and Transportation, generate the report each year, as required by the General Assembly. The current report represents activities from July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009.

The report also found that:

- More glass, plastic and aluminum containers were recovered for recycling than in any previous fiscal year. More than 110,000 tons of containers were recovered and sent to recycling facilities due to strong curbside recycling and drop-off measures already in place and a Jan. 1, 2008, law requiring businesses with Alcoholic Beverage Commission permits to recycle glass, plastic and aluminum.
- Curbside recycling programs contributed more to recycling in North Carolina than did recycling at drop-off centers. This

finding marked a first in North Carolina since local governments started providing the state with reports about their recycling programs in the early 1990s.

The report recommends increasing state oversight of disposal facilities and transfer stations to prevent the disposal in landfills of banned materials. North Carolina has increased the number of banned items to encourage greater recycling and keep harmful materials out of landfills. To prevent contamination, the annual report also calls for actions to reduce the amount of mercury-containing waste from being placed in unlined landfills.

State officials say that less waste generation this year is good news, but much still must be done to meet recycling needs and limit the expansion of the waste stream in the future.

"We certainly generated less waste in fiscal 2008-09," said Scott Mouw, an environmental supervisor with the state Division of Pollution Prevention and Environmental Assistance. "But we're still throwing away a lot of commodities that produce jobs and products North Carolinians use every day."

Social Services Needs Exceed Available Funds

The old and half million dollars in financial support has been cut from agencies responsible for providing mental health services in a five county district which includes Granville County.

Valerie Hencke, the director of the Five County Mental Health Authority reported to the Granville County Commissioners that funding is being cut at the same time that the need for these services are growing exponentially.

The current mission is helping people in need with mental health and social services support.

At the same time cuts in funding for the individual service providers have meant that there are less people and resources to help the increasing number of people seeking services.

Hencke, who is the vice president of the Central Regional Hospital, American Mile Hospital, reported to the county commissioners that state funds, mental health funds, and Medicaid funds have all been cut.

The effects that are noted by the agencies of the five county mental health authority include individuals that are mentally ill, diagnosed, but not being treated or hospitalized.

Hencke reported that her agency has worked to develop a plan to the best job possible with the funding that is currently available.

The director reported that waiting lists are increasing and some services are going to be scaled off in some areas.

Hencke said that the mental health authority had developed a plan for providing the most services for the money that was available.

Reductions in services will have to be made, she reported, but the authority will work to make sure that will have the best impact possible on the most needed services.

At the same time the authority will directly monitor organizations to make sure the greatest support is given in organizations that do the best job of providing the best services to the most clients.

Hencke said the local agencies working for the authority are making valiant and ongoing efforts while the demand for services are increasing.

She said that her purpose in explaining the situation to the commissioners was not to ask for more money from county funds but rather to help them understand about the situation that agencies and those needing the services are experiencing.

Seeking Social Security Disability Benefits

Dear Savvy Senior

What do I need to do to get Social Security disability? I'm 58 years old and have back problems that are keeping me from doing my job, but I've heard it's very difficult to actually get disability benefits. What tips can you offer?

Disabled Dave

Dear Dave,

The process of getting Social Security disability benefits can be tricky and time-consuming, but you can help yourself by doing some homework and getting prepared. Here's what you should know.

Last year, around 3 million people applied for Social Security disability benefits, but two-thirds of them were denied. Why the high denial rate? Because most applicants fail to provide sufficient medical evidence that prove they're disabled and can't work. While there are no magic tips to getting Social Security disability, there are several steps you can take to give yourself a better chance for a favorable decision.

Get Informed

Your first step is to know if your disability meets Uncle Sam's criteria. Social Security strictly requires that you must be physically or mentally unable to perform "any" substantial work and have a medical condition that's lasted or is expected to last at least a year or result in death. You must also have worked five out of the last 10 years and be under full retirement age. For more details, see ssa.gov/dibplan/dqualify4.htm and go through the five questions Social Security uses to decide if you're disabled.

If you think you qualify, your next step is to learn all you can about how the program works. Your best resource is SocialSecurity.gov - click on "Disability." Or, if you don't have Internet access, Social Security offers lots of free publications that you can have mailed to you including "Disability Benefits" (publication No. 05-10029) which provides a good comprehensive overview. Call 800-772-1213 to order publications.

Get Prepared

After you bone up, your next step is to gather up your personal, financial and medical information so you can be prepared and organized for the application process. You'll need your Social Security number; birth certificate; names, addresses and phone numbers of the doctors, hospitals and clinics that took care of you and dates of your visits; names and dosage of all the medicine you take; medical records from your doctors, therapists, hospitals and clinics; lab and test results; documents stating your physician's objective view of your condition, restrictions and limitations; a summary of where you worked and the kind of work you did; and a copy of your most recent W-2 Form or, if you are self-employed, your federal tax return for the past year.

How to Apply

After you get your information together, you can apply either online at ssa.gov/applyfordisability, or call 800-772-1213 to make an appointment to apply at your local Social Security office or to set up an appointment for someone to take your claim over the phone. The whole process lasts about an hour. If you schedule an appointment, a "Disability Starter Kit" that will help you get ready for your interview will be mailed to you. If you apply online, the kit is available at ssa.gov/disability.

Be Patient

It takes three to five months from the initial application to receive either an award or initial denial of disability benefits. The only exception is if you have a chronic illness that qualifies you for a "compassionate allowance," (see ssa.gov/compassionateallowances) which fast-tracks cases within 10 days.

Be Persistent

If Social Security denies your application for disability, you can request a hearing to appeal the decision, and you'll be happy to know that roughly 55 percent of cases that go through a round or two of appeals end with benefits being awarded. But the bad news is, with backlog of over 700,000 people currently waiting for a hearing, it will take a year or two for you to get one.

Get Help

If you are having trouble getting your applications in order or need help with your appeal, consider getting an attorney or a Social Security disability claims services company to represent you. A representative can only charge you if they're successful in getting you benefits. If they do succeed, typical fees are 25 percent of past-due benefits or \$6,000, whichever is less.

Don't Overlook Ways To Trim Your 2009 Tax Bill

Even though 2009 is history, you may still be able to trim your 2009 tax bill. Be sure you don't overlook these actions and deductions that could save you money.

Maximize your 2009 IRA contribution. You have until April 15, 2010, to make deductible 2009 contributions. The maximum 2009 contribution is \$5,000 (\$6,000 if you were 50 or older last year).

If you changed jobs in 2009, make sure you didn't have excess social security taxes withheld. Claim credit for the excess on your Form 1040 if you paid over \$6,622.

Look into itemizing deductions if you usually take the standard deduction. Search for allowable deductions that you might have overlooked, such as the 2009 deduction for state and local sales taxes in lieu of deducting state and local income taxes.

Medical deductions are allowable to the extent they exceed 7.5% of adjusted gross income (AGI). Don't forget items such as eyeglasses and hearing aids. You can deduct mileage for medical appointments at 24¢ a mile, plus parking and toll fees.

Don't overlook tax preparation fees, safe deposit costs, and certain investment advice. They all qualify as miscellaneous deductions, subject to a 2% of AGI limit. Up to \$2,500 of student loan interest is deductible whether you itemize or not.

The deduction of up to \$4,000 for qualified tuition and school expenses is available for 2009. Qualifying amounts for you, your spouse, and dependents may be deductible. Income limits apply.

If you're a teacher or teacher's aide, you can deduct up to \$250 for classroom supplies that you purchased with your own money.

If you purchased a hybrid gas-electric car in 2009, you may be entitled to a tax credit.

Even if you don't itemize deductions, you can take a deduction of up to \$1,000 (\$500 for singles) for real estate taxes paid in 2009.

DOES IT MAKE SENSE?

NORTH CAROLINA COOPERATIVE EXTENSION

Understanding a problem is the first step to solving it. So when we look at the overriding problem in the country today - the recession and the likelihood of a slow recovery - our initial task is to understand how we got here. Let me see if I can weave a story that makes sense.

The starting point is you and me - the consumer - for the simple reason that we drive the economy. Three decades ago our behavior in the economy began to change. First, our wealth started to rise. Driven by the good stock market in the 1980s and 1990s and then the booming housing market in the decade from 1997 to 2007, average wealth per person (after taking out inflation) jumped 100 percent from 1980 to 2007. Never before were consumers so rich!

Simple economics dictated what happened next. With more wealth at hand, consumers were motivated to take on more debt. A big part of this debt came directly out of the rising value of our homes in the form of home equity loans. Consumers used this debt to purchase bigger homes, more vehicles and all the electronic gadgets that are so much a part of today's society.

Even with our greater borrowing, consumer debt rose at a slower rate than consumer wealth (75 percent versus 100 percent, again per person and adjusted for inflation). Furthermore, because interest rates on loans were falling after the early 1980s, consumers easily financed this additional borrowing from their budgets. Indeed, consumer debt payments as a percent of their income rose only 30 percent during the period - less than one-third as fast as wealth.

And because our wealth was rising from the booming stock and housing markets, we had less motivation to save money out of our paychecks. The personal saving rate dropped from 10 percent in 1980 to almost nothing by the mid-2000s.

So here's the situation for consumers in 2007: they had a record level of debt and were spending virtually everything from their paychecks. Yet it didn't matter because consumer wealth was also at a record high. In fact, on paper, consumers' financial situation looked very strong. Life was good!

Then, literally, the bottom fell out. Beginning in 2007 and continuing into 2008 and 2009, the wheels fell off both the stock and housing markets, causing an unprecedented (at least for modern times) plunge in consumer wealth. At the worst point, consumers collectively lost \$13 trillion of wealth, a full 20 percent of what they had before the recession.

With wealth down, consumers' high debt loads became exposed. The only way out of this situation was for consumers to spend less, save more and pay down on debt.

Lo and behold, this is exactly what consumers are doing. In the past two years, consumers have paid down 7 percent of their debt and have increased their saving rate from nothing to almost 5 percent. Debt payments as a percent of consumer income have also fallen by a full percentage point.

These individual actions are certainly good for consumers. It's a way for consumers to get their financial balance sheets back in order, and it's what any financial adviser would recommend. But what's good for the individual consumer may not be good for the overall economy.

Here's the issue. Spending by consumers still accounts for the majority of economic activity. If consumer spending is sluggish because people are spending less and saving more in order to reduce debt, then the economy will also be sluggish. A sluggish economy means jobs - even when they start to come back - will return very slowly.

This is why the majority of economists think the time period after the recession will continue to be challenging. Although the stock market has regained some of its losses and housing values seem to have stabilized, few forecast a return to pre-recessionary wealth levels any time soon. This means the frugality consumers started during the recession will continue even after the recession - perhaps for several years.

Some say we lived high on the hog in the almost 30 years from 1980 to 2007, and now we must pay for that party by tightening our collective belts. I don't totally agree with this characterization because it implies consumers threw caution to the wind when they spent more and saved less. However, as I've tried to explain, this high-spending and low-saving behavior made perfect sense when consumer wealth was rising.

Perhaps the lesson here is to be cautious of your wealth. We've certainly seen in the last three years that wealth can evaporate very quickly. Our wealth will increase again but probably at a slower pace. Yet maybe, you'll decide, this is a better way!
