WRITING YOUR BEST CLASSIFIED AD

- 1 Start with the item you are selling or the service you are offering. This makes it easier for the reader to locate your item or service. Be specific in which category you want your advertisement placed (see listings below).
- 2 Do not try to include too many items in single advertisement. Readers may see only the first item and overlook others that would receive more attention separately.
- 3 Check your spelling. Brand names are sometimes unique and not known to the proofreader. Include your telephone number in case there are questions in the preparation of your advertisement.
- 4 Include the price of the item you are selling. Studies indicate more than half of classified ad readers do not respond to advertisements that do not include a price.
- 5 Keep abbreviations to a minimum. Make it easy for readers to understand what you are selling or offering.
- 6 Place yourself in the reader's position. Ask what you would like to know about the item for sale or the service offered. Include information such as brand name other specific descriptions of an item.

The Butner Town Council will hold a public hearing on Thursday, May 6, 2010 at 7:00 P.M., in the South Granville Water and Sewer Authority Meeting Room at 209 West C Street, Butner, NC 27509.

The purpose of the public hearing is to hear the following amendments to the Land Development Ordinance:

Land Development Ordinance Amendments

A.10.01 Amendment to Article 3 Review and Approval Procedures
This amendment is intended to clarify language about filing appeals to special use permits and variances.

A.10.02 Amendment to Article 7 Use Standards
This amendment is intended to clarify some language in the Type III Retail uses about automobile sales due to the previously approved amendment to separate automobile sales from other Type III Retail uses.
This amendment would also allow home daycare with provisions.

A.10.03 Amendment to Article 8 General Development Standards
This amendment would add exterior building standards for new buildings in the Central Business District.

A.10.04 Amendment to Article 12 Sign Regulations
This amendment would make the regulations for signs in the Central and Neighborhood Business Districts different from those in the Office & Institutional District, specifically allowing signs in the Central and Neighborhood Business Districts to be internally illuminated, while continuing to allow only externally illuminated signage in the Office & Institutional District.

A.10.05 Amendment to Article 16 Flood Damage Prevention
The North Carolina Floodplain Mapping Program has noted that in previous years, Butner was shown on the Durham County Flood Insurance Rate Maps. As a result, we need to adopt those maps, in addition to the Granville County maps adopted as part of this ordinance.

Changes may be made in the advertised proposals, which reflect debate, objections, and discussions at the hearings. Any interested citizen is invited to attend.

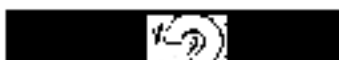

Request for Installment Financing Agreement

The Town of Butner North Carolina desires to enter into an installment financing agreement pursuant to N.C.G.S. Section 160A-20 in the principal amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the purpose of financing the cost of the project described below. The Town is soliciting your proposal to provide the necessary financing for this project, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Request for Proposal.

A. Pertinent Information

The project consists of the construction of a Town Hall Building. (the "Project")

The Town is currently not rated by Moody's Investors Service, by Standard & Poor's Rating Services nor by Fitch. The Town is currently in the process of being rated by the North Carolina Municipal Council. The Town was incorporated in 2007 and has to date incurred no debt.

The financing will be eligible under Section 265 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. [If Bank Qualified.]

The Town expects to obtain Local Government Commission approval of the installment financing agreement on July 6, 2010.

B. Contract specifications

The desired amount of financing is not to exceed \$2,000,000.

The desired term of the financing is 10 years. The Town desires the debt service to reflect amortization over a 10 year period.

Installment payments are to be made annually. The interest rate shall be fixed for the term.

The interest rate proposed must be guaranteed for at least sixty (60) days. The Town desires to close the transaction by the end of July 15, 2010.

Prepayment terms will be negotiated between the Town and the successful bidder. The Town desires the payment of principal at any time without penalty.

The Town's obligations under the installment financing agreement will be secured by a deed of trust or security interest in all or a portion of the project being financed as negotiated between the Town and the successful bidder. No deficiency judgment may be rendered against the Town for breach of a contractual obligation under the Installment Financing Agreement, and the taxing power of the Town will not be pledged to secure repayment thereunder.

The Installment Financing Agreement must not contain a non-substitution clause and there must be a non-appropriation clause in the installment financing agreement.

C. Submission of Proposal

- The interest rate.
- The terms of repayment. Please attach a debt payment schedule.
- Proposed terms for optional repayment. Please state whether you allow a prepayment without penalty from excess construction proceeds.
- A list of all additional costs to be associated with this transaction, including origination or placement fees, escrow fees, counsel fees and expenses. State whether or not any of such fees or expenses will be capped.
- A statement to the effect that the bank agrees to the contract specifications set forth in Part B of the Request for Proposal.
- Proposal collateral to secure financing and the method for creating a lien or security interest in such collateral.
- Bids should be based on gross funding of The Project (without consideration of investment earnings).
- The Town reserves the right to request additional information from the bidders and reserves the right to reject all proposals and to waive any irregularity or informality. Although the selection will be based substantially on lowest total financing cost (including both interest cost and upfront fees and expenses), the Town reserves the right to select the bidder that best meets the needs of the Town.

Young girls at age 12 are concentrating on becoming teenagers, being allowed to "have more freedom of choices", "hanging out with friends", and preparing for their future in high school (even though high school may be two years down the road.) Not so for Paulette Coleman.

Paulette, at the age of 12 was diagnosed with Bell's Palsy. Bell's Palsy is described as an injury involving the facial nerve located in the bony canal. All muscles necessary for facial expressions are frozen (paralyzed, motionless) according to medical science.

In elementary school, Paulette realized that her mouth was twisted, she could not close her eye and students were staring at her. "They call you names and kids can be cruel when your appearance is different."

Paulette's parents were Albert and Roena Brandon. She is also one of 15 children. When Paulette was diagnosed with Bell's Palsy, the doctor scheduled her for three visits per week. Unfortunately, Paulette's family did not own a car to travel to the doctor. How would a 12 year-old child get the medical attention that she needed without transportation?

"Thank God for a determined mother. Three days a week we would leave our home in Creedmoor walking to Durham but someone would always pick us up. My mother was determined that her daughter was going to the doctor."

In high school facial paralyzes did not prevent a young man named Bennie Lee Harris from asking her to marry him. Marriage is honorable but, what if you are only 16 years old and in the 9th grade?

Paulette said yes, married and birthed her oldest daughter at 16. Delayed graduation was inevitable. Not so for Paulette. Delay does not mean denial. One of her teachers and the principal encouraged her to complete her education.

Paulette returned to high school, birthed two more daughters and graduated on time.

She does not advise any young person to follow this path because, marriage, mothering and raising children while in school is more difficult than anyone could ever imagine. She was very thankful to have the support of her mother and mother in law.

"They kept the children and encouraged me by saying you can't quit high school or sit here at home. Go get your education!"

Two years later, she enrolled in college but was forced to withdraw because of personal difficulties. Ten years later she returned to college while working at Duke University and graduated from North Carolina Central University with a degree in Biology and a minor in Chemistry.

She is appreciative of the Duke PEP Program which was financially responsible for her education. She remained at Duke University for 20 years and left to pursue her dream in becoming an entrepreneur. She continues to pursue her dream in becoming a Licensed Supervisor in the Securities, Mortgage and Life Insurance Industry.

Paulette's success has not come without things going wrong or without a price. Her husband died suddenly, two of her sisters and one of her brothers died, her parents died and her 24 year old daughter, Belinda Harris, died suddenly after a surgical procedure which was suppose to have been routine. If that was not enough, her CEO, who was loving, vibrant and her business mentor died.

Paulette found that her strength was made perfect in weakness as she exercised her faith in God. She is also thankful for the support of everyone who has been instrumental in her career and personal life.

Paulette is married to Alfred Coleman, who has also experienced physical challenges. She is the mother of four daughters (one deceased) and ten grandchildren. When Paulette's sister Betty died, she became the aunt and mother of two of Betty's grandchildren.

Paulette realizes the importance of the phrase that she heard her mother echo: "Don't Quit!"

Should You Convert To A Roth IRA in 2010?

Due to a tax law enacted in 2006, certain high-income taxpayers will finally be able to convert a traditional IRA into a Roth IRA in 2010. But the decision to convert this year is not always as clear-cut as it first appears.

A Roth IRA offers several benefits to retirement-savers. For a Roth in existence at least five years, any "qualified distributions" are 100% tax-free. Qualified distributions include withdrawals that are made after age 59 1/2, on account of death or disability, or used for first-time home buyer's expenses (up to a lifetime limit of \$10,000). Also, unlike a traditional IRA, mandatory distributions are not required after age 70 1/2 for Roth IRAs.

If you convert a traditional deductible IRA to a Roth, you must pay tax on the converted amount at ordinary income rates. When converting a nondeductible IRA to a Roth, the earnings are subject to tax. The current top tax rate is 35%.

Previously, a conversion was not allowed if your modified adjusted gross income exceeded \$100,000. But the 2006 tax law change repealed this dollar cap, effective January 2010. Furthermore, if you convert to a Roth in 2010, the taxable income portion of the conversion may be split evenly over the following two years - 2011 and 2012.

Despite these advantages, a Roth IRA conversion requires careful consideration. For instance, if you must use funds in your traditional IRA to help pay the tax liability, you're effectively reducing the future Roth benefits. Other factors, such as your age and health status, projected rates of return, the potential for higher tax rates, and state tax implications could affect the outcome. In some cases, a partial conversion may be the optimal approach.

Online calculators may provide insight, but they often do not reflect all the relevant factors.

What Healthcare Reform Means for Seniors

Dear Savvy Senior

How will the new healthcare bill affect seniors? My wife and I both receive Medicare benefits and would like to know what we can expect.

Concerned Senior

Dear Concerned,

There are several ways the new healthcare reform law will affect seniors on Medicare and those planning for their retirement years. Here are some of the key changes you should be aware of.

Drug Benefit Boost

If you're one of the 27 million U.S. seniors who has a Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plan, healthcare reform has just upgraded your coverage. Seniors that fall into the coverage gap known as the doughnut hole will get a \$250 rebate to help pay for their medications this year, and a 50 percent discount on brand-name drugs next year. By 2020 the coverage gap will be eliminated. That means that seniors who now pay 100 percent of their drug costs once they're in the doughnut hole will pay 25 percent.

Currently, seniors fall into the doughnut hole once they hit their \$2,830 annual limit. Then they have to pay \$3,610 out-of-pocket for drugs before prescription coverage picks up again at \$6,440.

Free Screenings

In addition to the prescription drug plan improvements, Medicare's preventive services will also be beefed-up under the new law. Currently, traditional Medicare covers a one-time "Welcome to Medicare" physical, but only to new beneficiaries within the first 12 months of enrollment. And, they pay 80 percent of most health screening costs with you footing the bill for the remaining 20 percent. But starting next year, Medicare beneficiaries can get annual wellness exams and preventive tests, like screenings for high blood pressure, diabetes and certain cancers, for free.

Dis-Advantaged

The news isn't so good for seniors who have a Medicare Advantage plan. These are plans run by private insurers and are an alternative to Original Medicare (Part A and Part B). Many of these plans offer extra benefits that Original Medicare does not provide like free eyeglasses, hearing aids and even gym memberships. These extra benefits, however, come at an extra cost. Studies have shown that Medicare Advantage plans cost the government 14 percent more on average than Original Medicare. That's why the new healthcare law will cut around \$135 billion in subsidies over the next three-to-six years to the private insurers who offer these plans.

What all this means is that the 10 million seniors that have Medicare Advantage can expect their premiums or co-payments to increase, or their extra benefits to be reduced, or both, over the next few years.

Keep in mind that if you are enrolled in Medicare Advantage, you can switch to Original Medicare and join a prescription drug plan any time during the open enrollment period, which is between Nov. 15 and March 31, every year. To help you compare your Medicare Advantage plan with other plans in your area or with Original Medicare, visit www.medicare.gov/mppf or call 800-633-4227. And to evaluate Part D prescription drug plans, see www.medicare.gov/mpdpf.

Long-Term Care

Another provision in the healthcare reform law that older workers approaching retirement should know about is the Community Living Assistance Services and Supports (CLASS) Act, which is a voluntary long-term care insurance program available through employers. Starting next year, workers can set aside money from their paychecks to pay for services and supports that many will need in their old age or if they become disabled. This program is meant to help offset the high costs of home-based care, assisted-living facilities and nursing homes.

Those that pay into the program for at least five years will receive an average cash benefit of no less than \$50 a day when they need it. The details of the program, including the eligibility requirements, premiums and a mechanism that allows people to purchase insurance if they're self-employed or if their employers decline to participate, are being ironed out.
